Mike Lewandowski presented the Secretary/Treasurer's report (attached). Membership numbers remain roughly constant with a good influx of new members to compensate for members who leave the Chapter. The Chapter's finances are doing well. Our expenses are slightly increasing and include some replacement radiation sources used in the Radiation Instrument Kit. Costs for holding meetings is increasing due primarily to the cost to rent a facility and AV equipment. Income from Affiliate member support at meetings is increasing and helps to offset the increased facility costs. The Chapter finances are strong.


